- The GAO (Government Accounting Office) estimates that each program the government funds between 60% and 80% of every dollar goes to pay for its overhead, salaries, and all the other expenses of its existence. Only an average of about 30% of each dollar actually gets used for the purpose stated.
- Subcommittee on Federal Financial Management, Government Information, Federal Services and International Security August 2008 Committee Report:
 - The U.S. Sent a delegation to the XVII AIDS Conference in Mexico on August 3, 2008 — cost: **\$473,095**
 - The law allows money budgeted for AIDS research, treatment and prevention to be used for these conferences. *Section 696 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2008 (H.R. 2764), Public Law 110-161*
- It costs about \$8 to prevent the transmission of HIV from an infected mother to a newborn with the administration of the drug Nevirapine. For the cost of the trip the US could have prevented HIV in 9,136 newborns!
- Nashville Cares estimates it cost \$300,000 for the lifetime care for someone who is HIV-infected. Less then the cost for a trip for bureaucrats!
